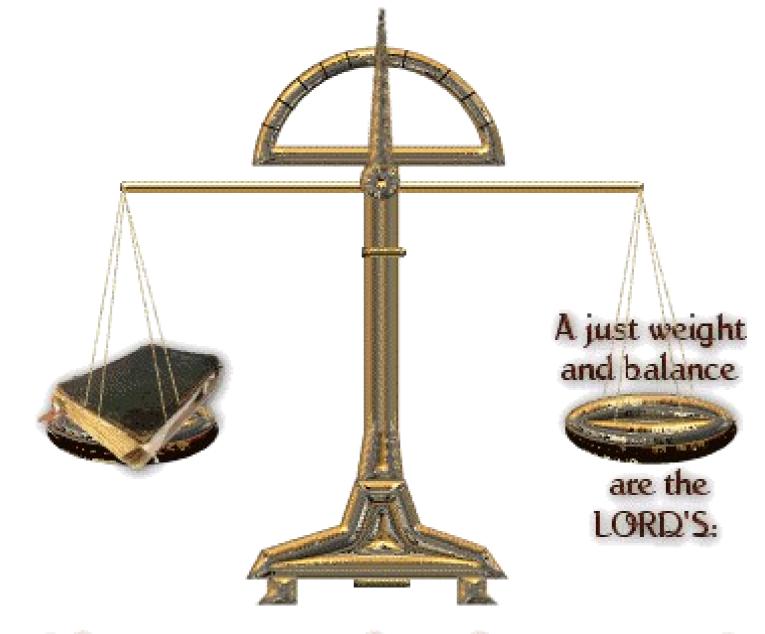

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## Thus saith the Lord...

## • Hebrews 1:1-2 God has in these last days spoken unto us by his Son,

• Are you listening?

### Hebrews 2:1 **Therefore** we ought to give the more earnest heed to the things which we have heard, lest at any time we should let them slip.

 In this verse, and in those which immediately follow, the apostle specifies a duty to be performed.

• "Therefore," looks back to all the varied glories which set forth **Christ's superiority** named in the previous chapter.

- Because He is
   "God's "Son,"
   therefore give heed.
- Because He is
   "the Heir of all things,"
   therefore give heed.
  - Because He
     "made the worlds,"
     therefore give heed.

- "The Queen of the South came from the uttermost parts of the earth to hear the wisdom of Solomon"
- But a greater than Solomon is here

(Mathew 12:42)

- It was usual with the prophets to preface their utterances with a "Thus saith the Lord,"
  - Used over
     400 times
     in O.T.
  - Here the apostle refers
     to the person of
     the Lord Himself
     as the argument for hearing
     what He said.

- "We ought to give the more earnest heed."
  - Here the apostle addresses
     the responsibility of his readers.
    - The Greek verb
      is very strong and emphatic;
      - It is often translated "must."
        - <u>1 Timothy 3:2</u>,
    - "A bishop must be blameless";
      - It is his duty.

- It is not an arbitrary matter, left to our own whim to do or not to do.
- It is a Divine precept,
   and God has commanded us

   "to keep His precepts diligently"
   (Psalms 119:4).
  - It is for
     our own happiness.

- The writer is arguing from the <u>less</u> to the <u>greater</u>.
  - He has in his mind two revelations.
- One was the revelation of the law which came by the medium of the angels, that is to say, the Ten Commandments.
  - Now any breach of that law was followed by strict and just punishment.

- The other argument
   was the revelation
   which came through
   Jesus Christ, the Son.
- Because it is infinitely greater than the revelation of God's truth brought by the angels;
- And therefore

   any transgression of it
   must be followed by

   a far more terrible punishment.

- If men cannot neglect the revelation which came through the <u>angels</u>,
  - How much less can they neglect the revelation which came through the Son?

- The **penalty** of neglecting this last word of God is great.
  - So the writer ask:

    "How shall we escape?"
  - The penalty is enhanced by the nature of the word.
    - It is a word of infinite grace.

- The <u>old word</u> was a word of duty.
- If breaches of the law had penalties attached, what must be the consequence of despising the gospel?

- In the first verse there is a very vivid picture.
- It is a picture of a <u>ring</u> that has slipped off the finger;
  - A <u>topic</u> that has slipped into the conversation;
- Of something slowly leaking.
  - Of something

     carelessly

     being allowed to become lost.

#### Warning Against Neglecting Salvation

## Hebrews 2:2 For if the word spoken by angels was stedfast.

- Why does the Apostle speak about the angels?
- He has shown from
   Psalm 2;92,110; 2 Samuel 7
  - •That Jesus is none other than God,
  - •And that therefore in His humanity also
    - He is highly exalted above all angels.

- We know nothing about angels, except what God pleases to tell us.
- All that men have imagined about them is of no importance, unless it agrees with the Divine record.
  - And Scripture tells us of the angels only, as it were, incidentally.

- Notice the multitude of the angels.
  - "We have come to an innumerable company of angels." (Hebrews 12:22)
  - Revelation 5:11

    and the number of them

    was ten thousand

    times ten thousand,

    and thousands of thousands;

- There are legions of angels.
  - There are the <u>cherubim</u> and the <u>seraphim</u>.
- This kingdom is intimately connected with the kingdom of grace.
  - When a sinner is converted the angels rejoice, (Luke 15:10)
  - And when Jesus comes again the angels will come with Him. (1 Thess 4:16)

#### The Parable of the Lost Coin

**Luke 15:8** ... what woman having ten pieces of silver, if she lose one piece, doth not light a candle, and sweep the house, and seek diligently till she find it? 15:9 And when she hath found it, she calleth her friends and her neighbours together, saying, Rejoice with me; for I have found the piece which I had lost. 15:10 Likewise, I say unto you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner that repenteth.

- Glorious as the angels are, they are in subjection to Jesus.
  - For in His human nature God has enthroned Him above all things.
- Their relation to Jesus fixes also their relation to us.
- "Are they not all ministering spirits, sent forth to minister to those who shall be heirs of salvation?"

  (Hebrews 1:14)

- The allusion is to the danger of failing to recognize:
- •Its superior character of grace and truth.

  (John 1: 14)

- Grace has the idea of something completely undeserved.
  - The word grace emphasizes at one and the same time the helpless poverty of man
    - And the unlimited kindness of God.

- Men had for ages thought of God in terms of <a href="mailto:power">power</a> and <a href="mailto:judgment">judgment</a>.
  - But in Jesus men are confronted with the sheer loveliness of God.
- A new idea of forgiveness and compassion.

 Jesus did not come to talk to men about God; He came to show men what God is like,

 Jesus is the one who, amidst the shadows, makes things clear;

Who, at the crossroads of life, shows us the right way:

Who at the moment of indecision, enables us to choose aright;

• Who, amidst the many confusing voices, tells us what to believe.

• The truth which Jesus brings liberates us from fear of God.

• John 4:18 There is no fear in love; but perfect love casts out fear: because fear has torment.

# • Perfect love liberates us from frustration of life

•Informs us to what life is all about?

- Liberates us from fears, weaknesses, defeats.
  - "I can do all things through Christ which fortifies me" (Philippians 4:13)
    - Jesus Christ is the great liberator!

 For most of us the threat of life is not so much that we suddenly plunge into disaster,

•But that we drift into sin.

- There are few people

   who deliberately

   and in a moment
   turn their backs on God;
  - But there are many

     who day by day

     drift farther and farther away from him.

- There are not many who in one moment of time commit some disastrous sin;
  - But there are many
     who almost imperceptibly
     involve themselves
     in some situation
     and suddenly awake
     to find that they have
     ruined life for themselves
     and someone else's life.
- We must be continually

   on the alert

   against the peril of the drifting life.

- "so great salvation."
- •Respecting as we do the word of angels,
  - •Let us respect
    His word more.

 The drifting current by which the Hebrews were in danger of being carried headlong was that of religious custom.

• There is <a href="mailto:great peril">great peril</a> in that current.

- Don't allow
   your soul
   to drift past the
   "Harbor of Life"
- Is your Soul Pilot awake or asleep?
- Are you casually drifting?

- By this current
   many are in danger of
   being carried away
   from the eternal hope.
- Carried down to the <u>Dead Sea of:</u>
  - Judaism,
- Mother and Dad religion,
- Grandmaw & Grandpaw's religion
  - Give me that Old-Time Religion!

## "Lest at any time we let them slip."


- •The danger is <u>real</u>.
