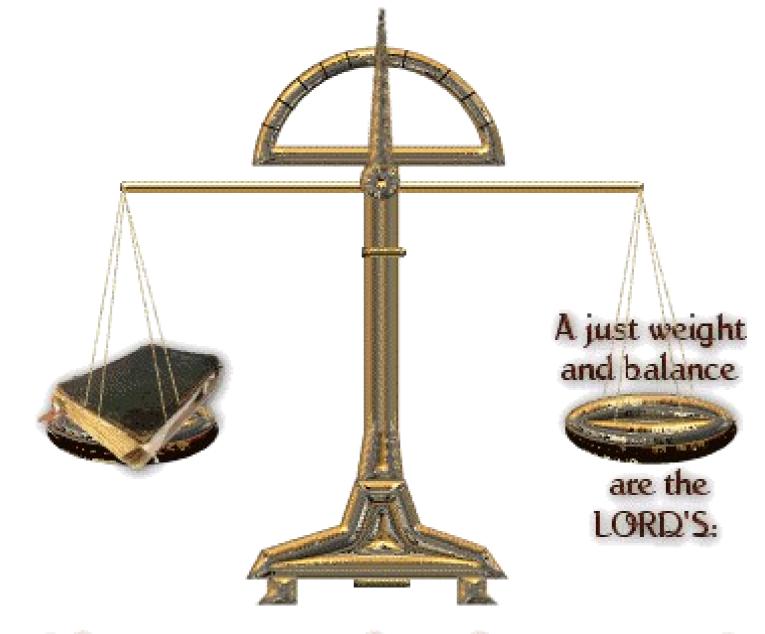

Thus saith the Lord...

- Hebrews 3:1Wherefore,
- holy brethren,
- partakers of the heavenly calling,
- consider the Apostle

 and High Priest
 of our profession,
 Christ Jesus;

- "Wherefore."
- This word is the connecting link between the two chapters which precede and the two that follow.
- It is a perfect transition, for it looks both ways.

- To "consider" Christ
 means to
 thoroughly ponder
 who and what He is;
 - The failure to "consider" Him causes us to let them "<u>slip</u>" (Hebrews 2:1)

 Some time ago a group of tourists were visiting in the city of Rome, and came to an enclosure

where a number of chickens were penned. The guide said:

"These are very unusual and distinctive chickens.

- They happen to be descendants of the rooster that crowed on the night in which Peter denied the Lord."
 - The tourists were impressed.
 - But one tourist turned to the guide, and said,
 - "Do they lay any eggs?"

 The real question to ask concerning our Apostle and **High Priest** is:

Can He do anything for me?

- Does the Bible have anything really helpful?
 - Can it aid me in my <u>anxiety</u> and <u>worry?</u>
 - Can it help me during critical medical issues?
 - Can it help me in <u>my marriage?</u>
- Can it provide relief from my fear of dying?

- We may be concerned about <u>Russia</u> and <u>China</u>
- But what about the <u>day to day problems of</u> <u>nervous tension, resentment</u> or <u>bitterness</u>.
 - These are the ones which take their bitter toll of us each day.

 The Lord Jesus, in his coming to earth, became a man that He could be a <u>compassionate</u> and

merciful High Priest

- Providing help
 in moments
 of temptation.
- When our Lord was tempted by the Devil he had one answer:

"It is written." (Matthew 4)

- Chapter 3
 is asking us
 to consider the
 astonishing solution
 that is offered by Jesus.
- The nagging problems of frustration, anxiety, and all the neuroses and psychoses that are so familiar today.

• He bids his hearers fix their attention on Jesus. (Hebrews 2:9)

- The word he uses is "consider".
- It does not mean simply to notice a thing.
 - Anyone can look
 at a thing
 without really seeing it.

- The word means to fix the attention on something
- To do it in such a way that its inner meaning is understood.
 - That the lesson it is designed to teach, may be learned.

• In Luke 12:24

Jesus uses the same word when he says:
"Consider the ravens."

He does not merely mean,
 "Look at the ravens."

He means,
 "Look at the ravens
 and understand and learn
 the lesson that God is seeking
 to teach you through them."

- If we are ever to learn the truth, a detached glance is never enough;
- There must be a concentrated gaze of the mind in a determined effort to see its meaning for us.

 What is there in the teachings of Jesus that we have missed?

- What is there to learn in the parable of the Ravens
 (Luke 24.)
- It is also called the Parable of the Rich Fool.
 - How does this teaching of Jesus help us?

- Two things stand out about this rich man.
- (1) He never saw beyond himself.
 - There is no parable which is so full of the words:
 - I, me, my and mine.
- (2) He never saw beyond this world.

All his plans were made on the basis of life here.

- To "consider"
- It is failure to thoroughly weigh crucial matters which causes us to let them "<u>slip</u>" (Hebrews 2:1)

- And it is our failure
 "to consider"
 which explains
 why
- We know so little about Him,
 - Why we love Him so feebly,
 - Why we trust Him so imperfectly.

- Let us also dwell on the word "holy"
 (Hebrews 3:1)
 - · Holy is God's ideal for us.
 - Ephesians 1:4
 "that we should be holy and without blame"

- A <u>temple</u> is holy because it is different from other buildings;
 - God is supremely holy because he is different from men;
- So, then, God chose the <u>Christian</u> that he should be different from other men. 23

- It must always be remembered that this difference on which Christ insists is:
 - Not one which takes one out of the world;
 - But one who is different within the world.
 - It is God's intent for mankind to be, like Himself.

 Again, Our question is: What can this **Apostle High Priest** do for me? (Hebrews 3:1)

- # 1
- God's will has been revealed to us. (Ephesians 1:8-10).
 - It had been

 a secret

 since the foundation of the world.
 - Matthew 13:35
- A secret that even
 the angels wondered about.
 (1 Peter 1:12)

• <u>2</u>

- <u>He has forgiven us</u> (Ephesians 1:7).
 - •The word

 "forgive"

 literally means

 "to send away."
- Sin is a terrible burden that is sent away
 by the blood of Jesus.

 1 Peter 2:24 (BBE) He took our sins on himself, giving his body to be nailed on the tree, so that we, being dead to sin, might have a new life in righteousness, and by his wounds we have been made well.

- It is pictured by
 the scapegoat
 on the Day of Atonement,
 taken into the wilderness
 (Leviticus 16:20-22).
- We see in this God meeting his people's needs.
- How like a Heavenly Father he watches over us, his people, with tender, compassionate care!

In the Sermon on the Mount we see Jesus setting forth the secrets of life.

 He goes through a list of things that men seek for, and he says to his own: 30

- "I don't want you to be anxious {G_3309}
- About what you shall eat or drink
- or how you are going to be clothed.

• But," he says, "the essential thing is:

- seek first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness
 - and then he adds,
- "and all these other things will be added unto you..."

 (Matthew 6:31-33).

- How we have reversed that!
- We spend our time and energy thinking about:
 - How to get money, food clothing, etc.
 - And we have just
 a little time left over
 for the essentials.
 - No wonder so many lives lived backward!

- But once again, we are called by God to put life back in balance.
- Despite all the accumulation of human knowledge we cannot handle life adequately by ourselves.
 - So what is man to do?

- We find the answer in Jesus Christ.
 - Our greatHigh Priest.
 - •Because we don't understand the mysteries of life.

- We need

 a standard

 to measure life by.
- •No mortal man has ever done that.

Something to tell us the difference between what will hurt us and what will help us.

What will advance us and what will destroy us.

We need God's word to help us to distinguish between right and wrong and good and evil.

 That is not easy to do, but God has provided a standard.

- #3
- He has redeemed us (Ephesians 1:7).
- By giving His life on the cross,
 - Christ

 purchased us

 from the

 slavery of sin.
 - He has delivered us <u>from the penalty</u> and power of sin

 The great thing that God is after, the ultimate purpose of our lives. is to appear in a face to face encounter with the living God. (Genesis 3:8)

- We can never forget that one day long ago when Adam & Eve walked with God in the garden in the cool of the day.
- We still long for that!
- And no human relationship can quite satisfy that yearning. 42

- The difficulty is that the <u>sin</u> and <u>evil</u> of our life <u>veil us from the</u> <u>face of God</u>,
- Since the fall in the garden
 our confidence
 in walking with God.
 - Has failed us.

We have a troubled conscience.

But the
 <u>ultimate end</u>
 of God's work with us
 is to give us
 <u>a clear conscience.</u>

Before him and before men.


- Let us now note that we have
